

The Cabinet of the United Kingdom

- The Cabinet of the United Kingdom is the collective decision-making body of the Monarch, Government of the United Kingdom. It consists of the Prime Minister and other heads of the executive departments and the most senior of the government ministers.
- Ministers of the Crown, and especially ministers are selected primarily from the elected members of the House of Commons and from the House of Lords, by the Prime Minister.
- Cabinet ministers are often the heads of the government departments. Even some ministers can be ministers without portfolio.
- Certain other cabinet ministers are in a somewhat hybrid position, where they have a portfolio, but do not head of a government department.
- The most powerful minister, the Prime Minister heads no department, although the Prime Minister's office coordinates their oversight of the whole government.
- The Cabinet is the ultimate decision-making body of the executive within the political system of the UK.
- In modern political era, the Prime Minister releases information concerning cabinet rank in a form of a list detailing the seniority of all cabinet ministers.
